Our hope is that we will continue to embed this practice of an intensive, reading intervention into the Primary Language Curriculum for Senior Infants, 1st and 2nd classes over the next few years.

New Policies

Over the past few months, Members of the BOM and the PA have been drafting a new Critical Incident Management Plan. A team is now in place, the members of which will meet a couple of times during the year to ensure preparedness in managing a critical incident in our school or within our community. In compliance with Children First Guidelines 2017, our Child Safeguarding Statement 2018 is now on our website, followed shortly by the school's Risk Assessment for 2018.

As part of our child protection procedures

- Parents/adults enter the school through the reception/office area only
- Parents/adults should not enter the school through the main door
- The main entrance is for children only
- Parents/adults are required to check in at reception and wear a visitor ID while in the school
- Parents/adults who wish to use the bathroom facilities during school hours must sign in at reception

We very much appreciate your understanding and support in this matter. Our priority is to reduce any risk of harm to children by identifying all adults who enter the building.

Science

Our two 4th classes were invited to Jesus and Mary College to celebrate their 'Science Fest'. The children got the chance to view various projects carried out by the current Transition Year students for the festival. As part of their visit the children were given the wonderful opportunity to visit the science labs and carry out some experiments. An exciting, informative morning was had by all!

During Engineer's Week two engineers from Jacob's Engineering gave a presentation on the work of engineer's to both classes as part of the STEPS programme. After the presentation the children carried out an experiment called 'The Marshmallow Challenge'. Their challenge was to create a sturdy structure using pasta and marshmallows.

Heritage in School's Visitors

As part of the Heritage in School's Programme, the children in 5th and 6th classes enjoyed a workshop on World War 1, which was given by historian Aidan Dockery.

With clipboards in hand, our two 4th classes participated in a guided History Trail of Dundrum. Our guide was historian, Tomas Maher.

Helpful Hints for the Smooth Running of the School
