OLG I.T. NEWS

Fifth Class are currently laying the groundwork for their I.T. Cluster Project. They are



learning about electricity in Science and will soon begin creating artwork on this topic. Using laptops, they have created files documenting their learning in their own words. These files, along with their artwork, will be the basis for their digital stories which will begin in January. Adobe Spark Video will allow the children to create their own unique digital story, documenting their learning journey through the topic of electricity.

First Class have just started logging into Spelling City for the very first time. They have been trying really hard to learn their

usernames and passwords off by heart. Many of the children in First Class have older siblings and so have heard about Spelling City before, building their excitement about having their own accounts. Soon they will begin to use Spelling City at home as part of their homework.

Second Class have had their very first (for most) taster session of coding on the iPads. Tynker is a simple app that offers a great introduction to coding for beginners. While the children see only the fun they are having, teachers can see the benefits of coding such as enhancing logical thinking, paying attention to detail and learning problem solving skills. This app has been a great hit with Second Class.





Third Class have been learning how to use *PowerPoint* on our laptops. They have now created their very first PowerPoint presentation on the countries involved in the Rugby World Cup. As well as learning how to use PowerPoint, the children have also been learning how to use safe sites such as dkfindout and kiddle.co for research and gathering information.
