

Adding cards to make 10

Making Ten

This is a game for two players and you will need a pack of cards.

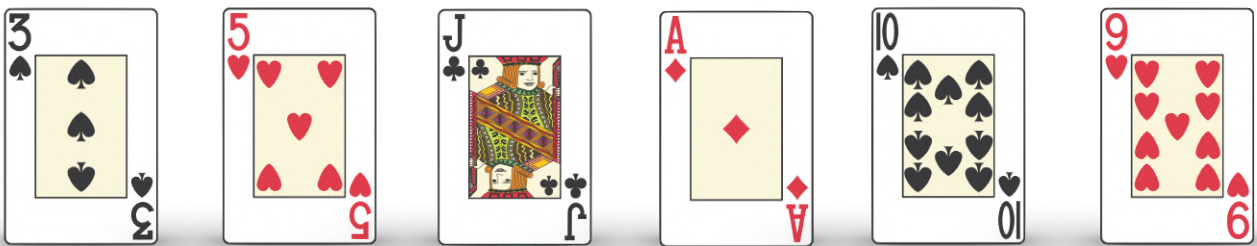


In this game:

- Aces count as one and Jacks count as ten.
- Queens and Kings are not needed and can be removed from the deck.

How to play

1. Shuffle the cards and place six cards face up in a line. These are the 'match' cards.



2. Deal the rest of the cards, face down, between both players.

3. Player 1 turns one of their cards over:

- If that card can be paired with one of the match cards to make a total of 10, the player wins both cards and puts them into their separate winning pile. They can then have another turn.
- If their card cannot be paired with one of the match cards to make a total of 10, the player should add the unpaired card to the line of match cards. Play passes to the other player.

4. Player 2 takes their turn, trying to pair the top card in their pile with one of the match cards to make a total of 10.

Continue taking turns until one of the players has no more cards to play with. They are the winner!
